Beaujolais Blanc 2008

\$13.99 per bottle **or \$151.09** per case

Jean-Paul Brun operates his family's forty acre Estate in the Beaujolais region of France. He grows a small amount of Chardonnay in a limestone soil vineyard, just like his neighbors in Northern Burgundy. No oak is used during fermentation making the fruit and soil the focus of this wine. We were just blown away by this wine! It is bright and fresh with great, clean acidity.

Layers White 2009

The red wines of Peter Lehmann have been staples here at Table & Vine for as long as we can remember and that is part of what makes the introduction of this white wine so exciting! The other part is obviously the wine itself. A great value, Layers White is a blend of Sémillon, Chardonnay, Pinot Gris, Gewürztraminer and Muscat. It is ripe and easy to drink, but not soft or clumsy. *It's a rather terrific, vibrant wine that really wants to join your table for any foods you are enjoying that needs a bit more intensely-flavored white wine!*
